Beloved Confreres.

Once again we are celebrating the birthday of the Mother Church in this great feast of the Pentecost. We are reminded of the immeasurable power of the Spirit who guides us, leads us and strengthens us in our life and mission. The praying community of the Apostles is through the power of the Holy Spirit is transformed to be an effective agent of transformation for the rest of the community. Illumined by the Holy Spirit, we see Apostles and the early Christian community display a rare spirit of joy in their lives. Though trial, persecution and suffering accompanied them, joy was their distinct mark!

Our patron says: However the abundant the fountain, its waters will not enter into a garden, according to the extent of its flow, but according to the narrowness or the largeness of the canal through which its waters are made to flow. Church in Tanzania is under threat?

In the recent past we have been receiving clear indications from various sources regarding planned attacks on Christians in Tanzania. In my previous circular (EAP-JK14 dt. March 28, 2013) I had mentioned about the same. However one more tragic event has taken place with the bomb blast at Olacity in the suburbs of Arusha City where SVD Missionaries are working. The atrocious event took place on May 5, Sunday when the blessing of the newly constructed church was about to begin. The persons present on the spot included dignitaries such as His Grace Archbishop Josephat Lubulu, the Archbishop of Arusha, His Excellency Archbishop Francisco Montecillo Padilla, the Apostolic Nuncio to Tanzania, government officials, political leaders, several priests, religious and lay faithful and well-wishers and friends belonging to different faith groups and denominations. Very unfortunately three died, many injured and several are still under shock.

On behalf of all of us I had personal communication with both the Archbishop of Arusha and the Apostolic Nuncio expressing our deep concern and promising our prayers. They reciprocate sentiments of gratitude and prayers to all of us. Let us also remember the departed ones, the sorrowed families and the entire family of Christian faith and the

people of good will in all religions. Let us remember: It is when we are challenged we grow. God allows these and similar things in our lives, with the purpose of drawing us closer to him. Let nothing discourage us. Let no adverse situation blow off our missionary zeal. Through our prayers supplemented by mortification and penance let us strengthen one another, and strengthen the faithful entrusted to our care. It is also a call for us to make real efforts for inter-religious harmony.

Rev. Fr. Agnelo Fernandes MSFS - General Councilor

MSFS hands over the Isaka Parish to Kahama Diocese

With effect from May 1, 2013 MSFS is no more rendering direct pastoral services at Isaka Parish, Kahama Tanzania. It was on September 22, 1993 up on the invitation of Most Rev. Mathias Shija the former Bishop of Kahama, MSFS began officially its ministry in the Catholic Diocese of Kahama when we were entrusted with the Mbulu Parish together with the several outstations. In the course of time the church there flourished and as a result, in the year 2006, the Mbulu Parish was divided into three parishes namely: Mbulu, Kagongwa and Isaka by the Bishop and the mother parish Mbulu was entrusted back to the Diocese by the MSFS. MSFS was then entrusted with one of the new parishes ie Isaka where we had the pastoral ministry until recently. Due to the acute shortage of priests, we were not in a position to renew the contract with the Diocese for further ministry in Isaka, as the contract came to an end on April 30, 2013. Although being fully aware of the need to have priests in Kahama, as the Diocese itself is having shortage of personnel and in spite of earnest plea from the Local Ordinary, it was with much pain we had to arrive at the decision not to renew the contract, knowing fully our present condition of lack of personnel. It was a decision after due reflections and prayers, involving enough consultation and discernment.

I sincerely thank **His Lordship Ludovick Joseph Minde ALCP/OSS** the Bishop of Kahama for the trust placed on us and the collaboration offered to us in the past. We also recall with deep sentiments of gratitude **His Lordship Bishop Emeritus Most Rev. Mathew Shija** the former Bishop of Kahama who paved the way for us to start our mission in Kahama. We also thank all the other Diocesan authorities and the lay faithful for the great support they have rendered to us. In my letter to the Bishop I have expressed clearly our readiness to be the service of the Diocese in the future when we are in apposition to do so.

In the thanksgiving Eucharistic celebration on April 28, Sunday at Isaka Parish Rev. Fr. Isaiah Bahati the Vicar General of the Diocese officially communicated the decision to the faithful and thanked the MSFS for the services rendered so far in the Diocese. The handing over was done very smoothly on April 29, in the presence of Fr. Isaiah Bahati, Fr. Rogatus Malulu and Fr. Andrew Maziku as delegates of the Bishop, representing the Diocese, Fr. Pius Kochuparampil the Parish Priest, Fr. Santhosh Paul representing the Provincial Administration and Fr. Soosai Raju Robert representing the confreres working in Kahama Diocese together with the representatives from the parish leaders.

Let us entrust to the Lord this new scenario and seek the blessings of the Lord, up on all our plans and activities. My thanks and appreciation for all the confreres who have rendered their ministry in Isaka at one time or other. I also thank the General Administration of MSFS and the previous Provincial Administrations of East Africa Province in assisting us in this process of discernment. My special thanks to Fr. Pius Kochuparampil MSFS who spared no efforts for the meticulous preparations of all the documents, accounts and data facilitating the smooth handing over of the Isaka Parish to the Diocesan authorities.

With this new development we have no more MSFS community at Isaka. The MSFS Community at Mwakata remains and congregation retains ownership and management of the three institutions that we have in the territory of the Diocese of Kahama namely and SFS Vocational Training Centre Mwakata, De Sales English Medium School Isaka and SFS Primary School, Kagongwa. The confreres at MSFS community at Mwakata are to function in close collaboration with local church and engaging themselves in pastoral ministry in

the diocese when needed and possible. We wish them all the graces and blessings they are in need of.

Jubilee Matters: Jubilee Cross

I would like to share with you the following regarding the JUBILEE CROSS. After having taken to Tabora, Kahama, Uganda and Kenya, I am very glad that now the cross is back in Arusha Tanzania.
