## **Beloved Confreres!**

## Cross and Sorrows: The Way chosen by God - lived by Our compassionate Mother !

Greetings of peace and joy as we are amidst two great feasts that speak of trials and tribulations: The feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross and Mother of Sorrows.

In all the universal religions, God being the source and dispenser of all that is good and the consolation of the sorrowful ones, it is very strange and incomprehensible as to why "Our God" (I do not mean the *Catholic God* - as Pope Francis is has very clearly taught and discarded the concept) chose this way of the cross. He chose this way because that was *his way*. The Son took up on himself the *same way* - for he was the beloved of the Father. The mother lived the way, for she was accompanying the son in this hard and challenging task.

Based on the biblical narrations and the traditions in the Church only seven sorrows are presented to us as arrows piercing through the heart of Blessed Mother Mary. But if we count, in our reasonable imagination the instances whereby she was sorrowed, we can be sure that Mother Mary had many more sorrowful moments in her life. No matter how many there were, Mary never lost hope. She was never impatient. She was never hurt or wounded for she always wore the armour of faith which gave her true protection. This shield of deep faith not only gave her protection but also just absorbed all the sharp arrows of sorrows. All the sorrows came to her. But no sorrow went forth from her. In faith she could absorb everything.

My dear friends, when sorrows come to us, how do we respond? Leave alone the sorrows: When the events take another course than that which we were expecting or had planned, do we not get panic and "make lot of noise"? In the all the sorrows of Mary, we find twist of events. She had planned or expected things in particular way. But God gave her other things in a different way - each time. She allowed herself to float in the turbulent current of the holy will of God. God never allowed her or let her be drowned.

In our daily life, the sorrows break us and put us asunder. We are lost; we get wounded; we are hurt. Sometimes we direct the arrows on others. At times a sense of false justice dominate our thoughts in such way that we want others also to experience the same sorrows. It can also happen that when God sends to us moments of challenges and sorrows, instead of responding to them in serenity marked by deep faith in God, we tend to react vehemently.

May our Mother be our inspiration. Mary stood by her son in his suffering. She was the one who in a very special way stood by our Holy Founder Servant of God Fr. Peter Mermier, in all those moments of dreadful challenges in founding our religious family of MSFS. Sure, this Mother of sorrow will stand by us her beloved sons in our moments of trials and tribulations.

The cross holds the promise of transformation to new life; we must embrace it. It comes in various forms of sorrows, challenges and struggles - as in the case of Blessed Mother.

We call Mary Mother of Sorrows: But she was never a sorrowful mother (a person who was lamenting and complaining) in terms of our thinking, for deep within her she had always the **Joy of the presence of God** in her life.

# Inauguration of the New Academic Year at the LCI

The Inauguration of the Seventh Academic Year (2016 – 2017) at the Lumen Christi Institute, Maji ya Chai, Arusha took place on Thursday, September 1, 2016. It was a memorable day for the Institute as the new Catechetical Centre and the new wing of the Scholasticate were blessed and inaugurated on the same day. This dream of the Congregation of the Missionaries of St Francis de Sales was actualized through the hard work of all our confreres and very specially of Fr Mathew Thazhathukunnel, the Director of the Institute and Fr Tomichan Perumanoor, the Administrator. Monsignor Daniel Pacho, the Secretary of the Nunciature in Tanzania officiated at these functions. After the blessings, at 9.30 am, there was the Inaugural Eucharistic Celebration.
