My dear Confreres,

Greetings of peace and joy in the name of Lord Jesus!

Today, we begin the season of Lent. Lent is one of the best times of the year for spiritual renewal. In some ways it can be considered as a forty day retreat lived each year in the context of our daily life. Socrates, the Greek Philosopher, says; “An unexamined life is not worth living.” This is valid in our modern times too. We live in a hyperactive world, where we have no time to think, reflect and examine our life. We are working so hard to achieve our noble dreams, that we sometimes forget our prayer life. We are often driven by the goal of success solely, and want to brand and promote ourselves. The modern gadgets around us give us the confidence that we are in control of everything; and live in a virtual world and ignore those around us. There exist also tendencies of indifference and apathy that prevent us from being true religious. Lent is a time for introspection, when we are asked to become aware of what is happening deep down in our minds, hearts and spiritual life. It is a “the favourable time of grace and salvation” (2Cor. 6:1). We are challenged to stop, look into our lives with eyes of faith, discern properly our values, set our priorities right and make radical choices and decisions that are in harmony with our Christian faith and deepen our relationship with God and with our fellow brothers and sisters.



Pope Francis in his Lenten message titled: “Because of the increase of iniquity, the love of many will grow cold” (Mt. 24:12), tells us that “God offers us each year the season of Lent as a “sacramental sign” of our conversion,” and therefore we are summoned to—and enabled to—come back to the Lord wholeheartedly and in every aspect of our life.” He warns us of false prophets and a cold heart. To overcome falsehood, negative tendencies and a cold heart, he encourages us to take up the Lenten journey with enthusiasm and sustained by almsgiving, fasting and prayer. He wants us to be guided by the Easter fire, the light of Christ, who dispels the darkness of our hearts and minds.

May this season of Lent be a season of personal and community renewal, guided by the life and message of Christ, who died and rose for our salvation.
