


# My dear Confreres,

The peace and joy of the Risen Saviour be with you! May we know and cherish the joy, peace and love of the Risen Lord every day of our lives. Happy Easter!

### The Lord is Risen, Alleluia

The resurrection of Jesus Christ is bursting with meaning for our lives, meaning that is applicable to us where we are now and where God wishes to lead us, just as he did to the holy women and early Christians. On the first Easter morning the sorrowing women came to anoint the body of Jesus and were greeted with the astonishing words of the angel: "Why do you search for the Living One among the dead? He is not here. He has been raised up" (Luke 24:5-6). What marvellous "Good News". Easter is a time of great joy. Christ, our hope, is risen! Imagine the joy of the apostles, the women, and of Mary, his Mother. All of them ready to go around the world announcing his message of redemption and salvation.

St. Paul reminds us that Easter has meaning for our daily living. If we really believe that Jesus is risen, then we must make a sincere effort each day to set our hearts on heavenly things (Col. 3:1). Jesus left his place at God's right hand to live



among us; now he has returned to his Father and invites us to live in him. We must try to focus on things above rather than on things of earth. This is a daily struggle for most of us. It's easy to focus on our own needs and wants, our own suffering and pain. These can easily distract us from the things that really count, that is, seeking God's will and loving others as Jesus has loved us.

When Jesus said, "I am the resurrection and the life (Jn. 11.25)," he was saying that he is the source of both. There is no resurrection apart from Christ, and there is no eternal life apart from Christ. Jesus confers this spiritual life on those who believe in him, so that they share his triumph over death (1 John 5:11-12). Believers in Jesus Christ will experience resurrection because, having the life Jesus gives, it is impossible for death to defeat them (1 Corinthians 15:53-57).

In order to experience the power of resurrection in our lives, we need to roll away the heavy stone over our hearts. We must recognize that the tomb is empty and that Jesus is risen. There are several heavy stones/sins that prevent us from experiencing the risen Lord. The person who encounters the risen Lord is a joyful person because he has understood the focus of his life, that is, he lives here on earth in order to attain eternal life. Joy is the gift of the risen Lord. He tells his apostles: "You have sorrow now, but I will see you again and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you...ask and you will receive, that your joy may be full (Jn.16:22-24). The disciples on the way to Emmaus had not yet experienced the risen Lord. They were sad, men without hope, men without courage (Lk. 24:17, 21, 29). But the moment they experience the risen Lord their sorrow is turned into joy, their hope is revived, they leave their shelter and boldly return to Jerusalem, braving the darkness of the night, to share their joy with the other disciples (Lk. 24:32-35).

My dear confreres, we are called to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. We are called to proclaim: "Rejoice and be glad, for the Lord is risen!" We can do this truly and effectively, if only we have the joy of Jesus. To have this joy we need to recognize Jesus who walks with us, as he did with those two disciples on the way to Emmaus. For this we need to be with him in the silence of our hearts, saying to him, "Lord, be with us, there is in our hearts the darkness of the night!" Let our hearts burn for Jesus who guarantees us eternal life through his resurrection.

Once we recognize him in our personal life, our night will become the morning of resurrection, and then we will run with joy, eager to tell others that "He is risen indeed. Alleluia!"
