STAY AT HOME WITH JESUS, STAY SAFE, HE IS ALIVE

The Easter message of peace, joy and hope is overshadowed by the unprecedented crisis of Covid-19. Easter is the feast of life, but we are confronted with death and disillusionment due to Coronavirus, which has spread across the globe. The sense of grief and loss associated with Coronavirus has social, economic, psychological and spiritual consequences beyond our comprehension as it affects the lives of everyone one way or other. The virus has upset even the age-old liturgical traditions of the Church. It has proven the inability of mighty governments and the inadequacy of superb healthcare systems of the world in combating its onslaught. It has exposed human frailty and vulnerability.



What does Covid-19 teach us during this Easter? Three years ago, on Palm Sunday Pope Francis had invited Christians to contemplate the face of Jesus "not only on paintings, or photographs, not only on video depictions" but "on the faces of many of our brothers and sisters . . . who are suffering." "Jesus is in them, in each of them with a disfigured face, with a broken voice, He asks to be looked at, to be recognized, to be loved." Satellite images show dramatic reduction in pollution, people see nearby mountains clearly, and water is cleaner etc. Some extreme environmentalists would say "Corona is the cure and humans are the disease." Whatever it may be, Covid-19 is inviting us to do justice to the earth and conserve the environment and wildlife as these are all vital to the eco system. Easter means new life. The present crisis provides us an opportunity to give the earth, which was suffering due to our selfishness, a new lease of life and invites us to preserve a healthy environment so that the present as well as the generations to come can enjoy a fuller life.

The Risen Lord is inviting us to be an epitome of love, justice, truth, peace and be responsible stewards of our planet. He exhorts us to be more human so that we can find the divine in our fellow human beings and in nature. Let these days of "social distancing" do not dishearten us but enable us to treasure one another. Let us STAY AT HOME with JESUS, who invites us to STAY SAFE by practising GOSPEL VALUES because He IS ALIVE, he gives us eternal life. May the Risen Lord fill our hearts with peace, courage and hope to overcome Covid-19 pandemic.

VISITATION OF SUPERIOR GENERAL

The Canonical Visitation of our beloved Superior General Rev. Fr. Abraham Vettuvelil to the Province of East Africa began on March 07, 2020. Fr. General could visit only communities and confreres in Tanzania as the borders of Kenya and Uganda were closed due to Covid-19. We are very grateful to Fr. General for visiting our Province amidst the fear of Coronavirus. He met every confrere personally, prayed together and animated every community with his



orientations to revamp religious life, community life as well as various apostolates absorbing the spirit of General Chapter 2019. Please see below the highlights of his animation in the communities:

1. Charism of our Congregation: He exhorted us to live the spirit and spirituality of St. Francis de Sales in our communities for the mission of Christ. All our apostolates should be guided by our Charism.

- 2. Community life: He invited confreres to live our consecrated life as envisaged in our hallowed Constitutions. He emphasised on essential ingredients of community life such as common prayer, common Eucharistic celebration, minimum of half hour adoration daily, common meal, annual retreat and community meeting. He insisted that community meeting should take place once every month in every community. It should evaluate the religious life and various apostolates of the community. The bursar of each community should present the statement of accounts of the previous month. He also exhorted every confrere to lead a disciplined community life animated by the superior. There should be regular and punctual attendance in every community exercise.
- **3. Mission**: He reminded that the essence of Fransalian way of life is the missionary dimension of our Charism as taught by our patron and the founder. In order to strengthen our missionary presence in East Africa Parish Mission Preaching (PMP), which is the primordial apostolate of the Congregation, has to be promoted. He insisted to form Fransalian Associates to spread the spirituality of St. Francis de Sales. He invited every confrere to promote the cause of our Founder Fr. Mermier.
- **4. Daily Prayers** should include the following too: Prayer for the Cause of Fr. Peter Mermier, Prayer for the deceased confreres (MSFS Obituary), Monthly intention of the Superior General and Prayer in preparation for the extra-ordinary General Chapter.

CONSULTATIVE PROCESS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF THE PROVINCIAL

Rev. Fr. Abraham Vettuvelil, our Superior General has requested me to initiate the process of the consultation for the appointment of the Provincial of East Africa in his letter dated 08.03.2020. The consultation will be done through eVoting/Online Voting as approved by the General Chapter 2019. The voting period will be from April 20 to May 10, 2020. The last day to cast vote will be on May 10, 2020. Fr. J. Stephen, General Councillor for SAIM is responsible for the preparation of eVoting. He will directly contact every eligible voter via email through which every confrere can register his vote. He will also explain the modalities of eVoting.

As per our Constitutions (Article 177) all the perpetually professed confreres of the Province are eligible to vote. As per article 179, to be a Provincial, one should have completed 30 years of age and 5 years in perpetual profession (on April 20, 2020). We have 72 perpetually professed confreres in East Africa. Fr. Johnson Kallidukil being a General Councillor has only passive voice and has no active voice in the consultation process. There are 71 confreres who can vote and 51 confreres, who can be voted for.

NEW WEBSITE OF THE PROVINCE
