


My dear Confreres!


ST. FRANCIS DE SALES AND FR. PETER MERMIER



As we commemorate the 400th death anniversary of our beloved patron St. Francis de Sales, it is imperative for us to reflect upon his influence on our venerable founder Fr. Peter Mermier. Undoubtedly, the missionary zeal and spirituality of St. Francis de Sales moulded the life and ministry of Fr. Mermier. Flagged by religious indifference after the French Revolution and the trauma left by Jansenism, people of Savoy were without any religious instruction for years. It is in this context that

St. Francis de Sales becomes a source of inspiration for Fr. Mermier to renew the faith of the people who were apathetic towards God and Catholic Spirituality.

Fr. Mermier was highly influenced by the life and example of St. Francis de Sales in his missionary endeavours and pastoral ministry. When his Bishop appointed young Fr. Mermier as the parish priest of Châtelard en Bauges, in the mountains of Savoy, all his attempts to revive the faith of the people met with failure due to the apathy of people. In 1821, in an attempt to rouse up his parishioners from their slumber, he decides to preach a mission in the parish with the help of Joseph Marie Favre, a renowned mission preacher. But it was a failure due to the indifference of the people. One fine morning, Fr. Mermier and Fr. Favre fled to the Monastery of the Carthusians, to pray for their obstinate parishioners. The Church bells remained silent and the presbytery was empty. This strange



behaviour of their priests at last succeeded in shaking the people out of their apathy.

They went in search of their priests, brought them back to the parish and the mission preaching resumed in full swing and it was a grand success. Fr. Mermier decided to give up all other forms of apostolate and devote himself entirely to the apostolate of preaching and conducting parish missions.

Fr. Mermier breathed the spirit and spirituality of St. Francis de Sales at all times. He named the small band of missionaries as "The Missionaries of St. Francis de Sales". In his letter to Cardinal Sermattei (29.05.1857), Fr. Mermier writes: "In confirming the title "Missionaries of St. Francis de

Sales", through this solemn approval, we will contract a more strict obligation of studying, of acquiring his spirit, of acquiring and imitating his virtues." In his letter to Fr. Neyret (30.06.1846), Fr. Mermier writes, "it is in honour of the saintly 'Apostle of Chablais' that we make use of the tumble-down hovels of the Castle....Let us do it with perfectly pure intentions so that our Congregation may obtain from this perfect model, a little of this spirit of zeal and meekness which will make us die to ourselves in order to live only for God and for the welfare of our brothers as other St. Francis de Sales."



Fr. Mermier wanted his fellow confreres to be like St. Francis de Sales at all times. He wrote to Fr. Gaiddon (24.02.1849) with regard to following the example of St. Francis de Sales in the missionary apostolate: "Our ministry demands that we show the people, the society, that we are other Saint Francis de Sales, perfectly disinterested, burning with zeal for the salvation of souls, full of compassion at the sight of the evils that afflict the people, without wasting our time in making useless speeches, but imbued with a genuine missionary spirit, an irreproachable doctrine and above everything else a pure life."

Fr. Mermier, when he wrote to Fr. Cheminal, exhorted his confreres to imitate the outstanding virtues of St. Francis de Sales (29.01.1843): "Ah! How I would like to have something of the patience and gentleness of St. Francis de Sales. I wish them for you and implore the Holy Protector to inspire you with them, to obtain them for you so that we may become similar to him, worthy ministers of Jesus Christ."

Fr. Mermier promoted unity among the confreres after the example of Jesus Christ and St. Francis de Sales. He wrote to the confreres in La Feuillette (20.09.1842): "You will be perfectly united by doing everything in the most cordial manner as brothers who love one another and have the true zeal of Jesus Christ and of St. Francis de Sales, our glorious and illustrated patron, who desire only the greatest glory of God, the salvation of people and their own salvation."

The life and example of Fr. Mermier in following the spirit and spirituality of St. Francis de Sales, is our legacy which we need to cherish in our life by becoming true witness of Christ in the contemporary world and promoting values of the Gospel.

On September 03, 2022 St. Bruno Sserunkuma Catholic Church Agururu (Tororo Archdiocese, Uganda) celebrated its golden jubilee with the theme: "Be holy for I am holy". The parish was erected in 1970. The Jubilee celebrations could not take place in 2020 due to covid. The church compound was teemed with Christians, old and young. The Jubilee celebration began with the blessing of the Jubilee gate by Archbishop Emmanuel Obbo. During the Holy Mass over 600 candidates received the sacrament of confirmation and three couples received matrimony.

The Archbishop in his homily thanked the priests who have served in Agururu and all the Christians for the spiritual and material developments of the parish. A cake was cut by the Archbishop together with the priest who had served longest in the parish, Msgr. Hippolytus Omodoi, Fr. Sunny Mattathil msfs, and all the elderly parishioners (70-100 years). The occasion was also graced by distinguished leaders from cultural, political and civil fields. The Adhola King, Moses Steven Owor, in his speech spoke about

Willemen to document the miracles that were experienced through the intercession of this girl Angelina Lyaka. The King requested the Archbishop to support the cause of

Angelina for beatification.

SILVER JUBILEE OF BUKENE SCHOOL





St Francis de Sales School Bukene was the first primary school of the Missionaries of St Francis de Sales in the continent of Africa. The school started with 27 pupils in kindergarten and the total strength of

the school this year is 378. On this day of jubilee, the 17th batch of class VII students graduated from the school. Jubilee is an occasion to celebrate, to recall the marvellous ways in which the school has fulfilled its mission in imparting education and in implanting moral and spiritual values and discipline, to help in building up leaders who will desseminate cultural and moral values which our society and country need today.
